### **PURPOSE**

The World Trade Week Education Committee annually offers scholarship awards to encourage outstanding young women and men to continue in post-secondary study in the field of International Trade. The amount of the award is \$500.

### **CRITERIA**

1. Scholarships are awarded to:  
Outstanding graduating high school seniors entering an accredited college or university with the goal to prepare for a profession in international trade.
  
2. A complete application includes:
  - a. Scholarship Award Application (typed)
  - b. One page essay discussing your future college and career goals as they relate to international trade (typed)
  - c. Two letters of recommendation (typed)
  - d. Official high school transcript

Winners must be present to accept the certificate and must provide proof of enrollment at a valid college or university to receive the scholarship check.

Essay

On an attached sheet of paper, write a typed one-page essay discussing your future college and career goals as they relate to international trade or business. You may include any special person, class, or event that inspired you to pursue studies in the international trade.

Transcript

Attach an official copy of your transcript from the counseling office with your application.

Letters of Recommendation

Ask two persons who know of your achievement, experiences and potential to write a letter recommending you for this scholarship award. Only one letter may be from a high school faculty member or administrator. If you have participated in community service or have had work experience may be another source for a recommendation.
