**EVENT TO HIGHLIGHT ALTERNATIVE ENERGY VEHICLES,  
CONSERVATION AND GREEN BUILDING**

*L. A. Area Chamber co-presents 'Energy Expo' on Wednesday, Aug. 17 at  
Torrance Cultural Arts Center*

**Los Angeles, CA** – By presenting “Lights, Power, Action,” an alternative energy conference today in Torrance, the Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce is working to highlight the importance of energy independence and fuel efficiency to our environment and national security. The event – to be co-presented with Global Green USA and Securing American’s Future Energy, and in cooperation with Congresswoman Jane Harman – will feature a display of 15 of the newest hybrid car models, including hydrogen fuel-cell power cars, from Honda, Toyota, Ford, Daimler Chrysler and other car companies. Local alternative technology companies will provide information about their programs and services.

The expo will be held 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Torrance Cultural Arts Center, 3330 Civic Center Drive North.

The event will also feature two panel discussions with experts on alternative energy sources:

- 12 to 1 p.m. **Hydrogen and Alternative Energy Vehicles.** Panelists include: S.
