Incredible India: Golden Triangle

APRIL 19, THU. – DEPART NORTH AMERICA

Today you will depart on your exciting journey to experience India's Golden Triangle, as you board your flight for Delhi.

APRIL 20, FRI. – ARRIVE DELHI

Tonight you will arrive in Delhi, India's bustling capital city. There you will be greeted with a traditional Indian welcome and then escorted to THE CLARIDGES NEW DELHI.

Delhi is a bustling metropolis, which successfully combines both the ancient and the modern aspects of Indian culture. The city's many monuments, located amidst tall, modern skyscrapers, stand as silent reminders of the region's ancient legacy. Delhi's strategic location was one of the main reasons why successive dynasties chose it as their seat of power. It is not surprising that today Delhi is actually a conglomerate of seven cities. The division between the old, walled city and what is known as New Delhi marks a division in lifestyles. The walled city retains its past traditions, and visitors can get a glimpse of its many facets. In contrast, New Delhi strives to match the pace of the twenty-first century.

APRIL 21, SAT. – NEW DELHI SIGHTSEEING

After a leisurely morning, you will embark on a tour of New Delhi, driving along Rajpath, the capital's broadest avenue. As you go, you will get a chance to see Parliament House, which is now known as Sansad Bhawan. It is a low, circular structure that covers more than five acres of land. You will also see Rashtrapati Bhawan, the President's Palace, which is the official residence of the president of India. Constructed on

Raisina Hill, it is an imposing structure with 340 rooms which was initially built as the official residence of the British viceroy of India. Next you will see India Gate, a 138-foot-high, arch-shaped structure that stands at the eastern end of Rajpath. On it are inscribed the names of 85,000 Indian Army soldiers who lost their lives in World War I, the North-West Frontier operations that occurred at the same time and the 1919 Afghan fiasco. Below it burns the Amar Jawan Jyoti, the Eternal Flame, in tribute to all martyred soldiers of India. The Amar Jawan Jyoti was lit after the 1971 Indo-Pakistan War.



Next you will proceed to Humayun's Tomb. The tomb, an elegant example of early Mughal architecture, was commissioned by Humayun's widowed queen, Haji Begum, in the sixteenth century. Architecturally it is the forerunner of the world-famous Taj Mahal. You will also have a chance to visit Qutab Minar, a soaring, 238-foot-high stone tower, which was built by Qutub-Ud-Din Aibak in the twelfth century. The tower has five distinct stories, each with a projecting balcony. At its base is the Quwwat-ul Islam Mosque,

the first mosque to be built in India. A twenty-three-foot-high iron pillar, which was built in the fourth century, stands in the courtyard of the mosque. After viewing Qutab Minar, you will move on to Birla Temple, which is one of the major landmarks of New Delhi. The temple, built in 1983, is dedicated to Vishnu and enshrines almost all the deities of the Hindu pantheon. The entire temple is decorated with relief carvings of mythological scenes. The temple reaches an impressive 165 feet at its highest point. This evening enjoy a welcome dinner. (BD)

APRIL 22, SUN. – OLD DELHI SIGHTSEEING / JAIPUR

This morning your visit will focus on Old Delhi, the seventeenth-century walled city of Shahjahanabad. You will visit the Red Fort, or Lal Quila, which is situated on the banks of the River Jamuna. Its thick, red-sandstone walls bulge with turrets and bastions and have withstood the ravages of both time and nature. Within the walls lie halls of public and private audience, domed and arched marble palaces, plush private apartments, a mosque and elaborately designed gardens. Even today, Lal Quila remains an impressive testimony to Mughal grandeur. Its magnificence leaves many awestruck and breathless.

Next you will visit the Raj Ghat, a memorial that is erected on the site where Mahatma Gandhi, the father of the Indian nation, was cremated. You will also view the Ashoka Pillar, which is a magnificent, fourteen-foot-high structure that was created in the third century. Made from polished sandstone and tapered toward the top, the pillar is inscribed with an admonition to promote peace in the world through the teachings of Buddha.

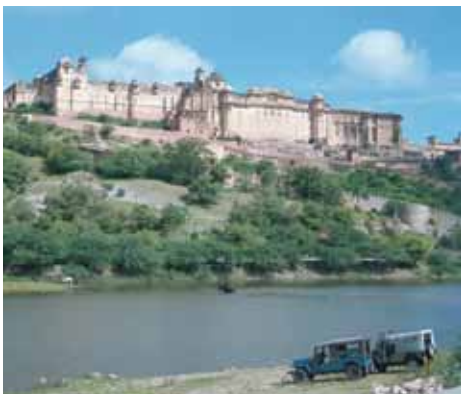


You will then take a walk through Chandni Chowk, the old marketplace of Shahjahanabad, which is now a picturesque bazaar. It consists of many narrow lanes that are crowded with shops selling everything from authentic Indian food and clothing to electronics.

Following your Old Delhi tour, drive to Jaipur, the capital city of Rajasthan. Upon arrival, check into FOUR POINTS BY SHERATON. (B)

APRIL 23, MON. – AMBER FORT EXCURSION / SANGANER

This morning you will enjoy the unique experience of riding a caparisoned elephant from the foothills to the ramparts of the ancient Amber Fort. The fort was once the capital of the Mina tribes, who are believed to be the original inhabitants of the area. Tales of the fort recall the glory and wealth of its association with the Mughals. Once inside, you will explore the Sheesh Mahal, or “Palace of Mirrors,” which is inlaid with millions of tiny, glistening mirrors, the hall of Public Audience and the beautiful manicured gardens.



This afternoon we shall familiarize ourselves with a charming story of an ancient Indian industry which was forced to reinvent itself and succeeded. Globalization and its resulting pressures existed before that term became fashionable.

Special Chamber Member Highlight: Kagziz Paper

APRIL 24, TUE. –

JAIPUR / FATEHPUR SIKRI / AGRA

This morning you will tour the city of Jaipur, which is steeped in heritage, picturesque with exquisite architecture and vibrant with heroic lore and romance. As you head off to visit the Hawa Mahal, or “Palace of Winds,” in the old city, you will learn why Jaipur is also called the “Pink City.” All of the houses in the old city, including the famous Hawa Mahal, were painted pink in 1905 to honor the visiting Prince of Wales. Since that time, the color pink has become equated with the hospitality for which the city is known. The Hawa Mahal is Jaipur’s central landmark and boasts an extraordinary façade comprised of many airy sandstone windows that were used by the court ladies to watch royal processions without being seen by outsiders.



Next you will explore City Palace, which is characterized by balconies, tiny windows, cupolas, courtyards and arched entryways. The palace now houses an excellent collection of Rajasthani costumes, miniatures and weaponry. Adjacent to the City Palace lies Jantar Mantar, the largest and best preserved of the five observatories built by Jaipur’s founder, Jai Singh. At first the observatory appears to be merely a scattering of abstract sculptures, but it is in fact a collection of huge masonry instruments used by medieval scholars to study and measure the positions of the stars, sun and planets.

In the afternoon, we drive to Agra. You will stop en route to visit the abandoned Mughal city of Fatehpur Sikri. This amazing city, a masterpiece of Muslim, Hindu and Jain architecture, was built by Akbar the Great in the sixteenth century. Comprised predominantly of red-sandstone buildings that sprawl over a huge area, the architectural style of the city is very much in tune with Akbar’s vision. A shortage of water was one of the main reasons the site was abandoned. After visiting Fatehpur Sikri, continue overland to Agra, the last capital of the Mughal Empire and home of the one and only Taj Mahal. Upon arrival, check into THE GATEWAY HOTEL (Taj). (B)

APRIL 25, WED. – AGRA SIGHTSEEING:

This morning you will be offered the possibility of a sunrise visit to the Taj Mahal. Agra is famous for the Taj Mahal, a World Heritage Site. However, the City is also well known for its leather industry. This morning we will visit Valentino.

Special Chamber Member Highlight: Valentino Shoes Production

After the visit, return to the hotel for lunch (own expense). In the afternoon, visit Agra Fort, a huge red-sandstone structure built by the famous Mughal emperor Akbar in the sixteenth century. It houses the beautiful Pearl Mosque and many other noteworthy structures. Next you will move on to that magnificent monument to the memory of love, the Taj Mahal. Built by Shah Jahan as a memorial to his beloved queen Mumtaz Mahal, the monument is made of white marble and is a fine example of symmetry, balance of design and traditional inlay work. As you tour the famed landmark, you will have an opportunity to enjoy its changing hues as is bathed in the warm glow of the sunset. (B)



APRIL 26, THU. – AGRA / DELHI

Morning drive to Delhi en route visiting the Tomb of Emperor Akbar. Upon arrival, check into THE TAJ PALACE HOTEL DELHI. This afternoon we will receive information on Delhi’s power supply and energy challenges.

APRIL 27, FRI. – DELHI

Today starts with a visit to one of India’s famed call centers. A visit to one of these centers will show you the other ‘end’ of that 800 number line we all sometimes talk through.

KAGZIS PAPER

The history of the handmade paper industry in Rajasthan goes back to 1456, when paper makers from Turkey settled in the area following military unrests. Their work was to produce paper and parchments for the Mughul court.

By the turn of the 16th century, the small band of paper-makers had developed into a guild, restricted to those born into the clan. They had adapted the surname, Kagzi, after 'kagaz' meaning paper. The only surviving settlement of Kagzis today is at Sanganer on the outskirts of Jaipur.

The art of handmade paper flourished under the patronage of the royal court of Sawai Man Singh and his successors. The easy availability of water and open spaces (two essentials for paper making) kept the Kagaz industry alive in Sanganer.

Sanganer today is one of the major handmade paper centers in the country. The industry here employs more than 1000 people.

VALENTINO SHOES PRODUCTION

Agra is not only known for its famous Taj Mahal, but also for its leather production facilities. This well known shoe production facility produces for the domestic and international markets and is in compliance with ISO standards.

DELHI'S ENERGY SUPPLY

Reliance Power Limited is a part of the Reliance Anil Dhriubhai Ambani Group group, one of India's largest business houses. The group comprises companies in the telecommunications, financial services, media and entertainment, infrastructure, and energy sectors. see how the distribution network is maintained, tracked and how billing is generated. Members are encouraged to ask questions.

Quattro is a global services company offering business and knowledge processing services to organizations worldwide seeking higher operational effectiveness, greater flexibility and lower operating costs.

With more than 200 enterprise clients, 9,500 small and medium size businesses, and 150,000 individual consumers around the world, our leadership team is known as "the pioneers of the Indian business process outsourcing industry.

We will visit the Quattro facility located in the IT hub of Gurgaon, close to Delhi's international airport. This building has a more than 2,000 seat facility. After checking in at the reception, we will be escorted to a conference room where an overview will be given on the systems and processes they have for their various clients.

After a presentation, the group will be taken to a live floor to witness the call center in action.

The shore temple, the only surviving one of seven, is a unique example of a temple built of rock quarried elsewhere and carried to shore. (B)

Your tour of Chennai takes you to Victoria Art Gallery, the Bronze Gallery and Chennai Museum. Fort St. George, San Thome Cathedral and Kapaleeswarar Temple complete your tour of Chennai. Afternoon is at leisure. Tonight, say farewell to unforgettable India; and board your flight to return home. (B)
